



Camp Crossroads is committed to following all necessary Covid risk management protocols required to run our programs safely. We will keep families updated as we receive directives from our local Public Health unit.

Since most of our activities take place outside in roughly 300 acres of beautiful fresh air, we are confident families can find the rest and refreshment they are looking for! However, we also understand that you might have some practical questions about what things will look like.

Here are a few areas where we are working to manage the risk of Covid 19 at family camp this summer:

1. **Food Service:** We will assign a specific table to each family for the week and provide a 6 foot buffer for each table. Families will be asked to wear masks while in transit to their tables. At this point we plan to either serve meals family style or call up families one at a time to be served in the food line. In summer, we often eat at least one meal a day outside and so we would also want to maximize the outdoor dining in good weather and just spread out the picnic tables to allow for social distancing. We have capped the family camp attendance at 80 people because that's what our dining hall capacity would be with social distancing (a normal family camp is more like 120-130 people).
2. **Chapels:** At this point, we are not planning for a time of family singing all together in the chapel but we continue to monitor restrictions and will clarify as the program approaches. Chapel times might need to start with parents dropping off their kids at the different locations that are designated at the time. In good weather this would be outside as much as possible. If indoors, we will make sure the space is big enough to allow for social distancing, and yes, if Covid restrictions require masks we will definitely require them here. We are also looking into renting a giant outdoor tent or two for additional open air spaces if that becomes necessary.
3. **Family Choice Weeks & the additional Kids Program options:** We are only allowing 8 kids to sign up for any one activity period and each of the activities we've selected are individual type activities that don't require physical contact between participants. We are hoping that kids who are engaged in outdoor activities would not be required to wear masks unless there is a specific need to do so. We are looking at moving the craft program outdoors in good weather, but if the kids need to be in the craft hut they would need to wear masks (unless things change). The other activities are ski/wake, swimming, fishing & horsemanship, all of which can be socially distanced. Our program staff will be trained on if/when masks would be required. For example in our horse program, our instructors know that when helping campers mount, they will wear masks but otherwise when they are 6 feet away from campers in outdoor spaces it is most likely not necessary.
4. **Family Showers:** The Grey Gables Units/Suites and Deluxe Cabins all have full private washrooms (including showers). Standard Cabins all have a 2 piece washroom but we are currently assigning these families exclusive access to a shower facility for the week. The trailer park sites would not have access to showers unless they come with their own RV facilities (each trailer pad has full water/septic hookups).
